Improve performance continuously, first to meet the standards, then to improve the standards themselves

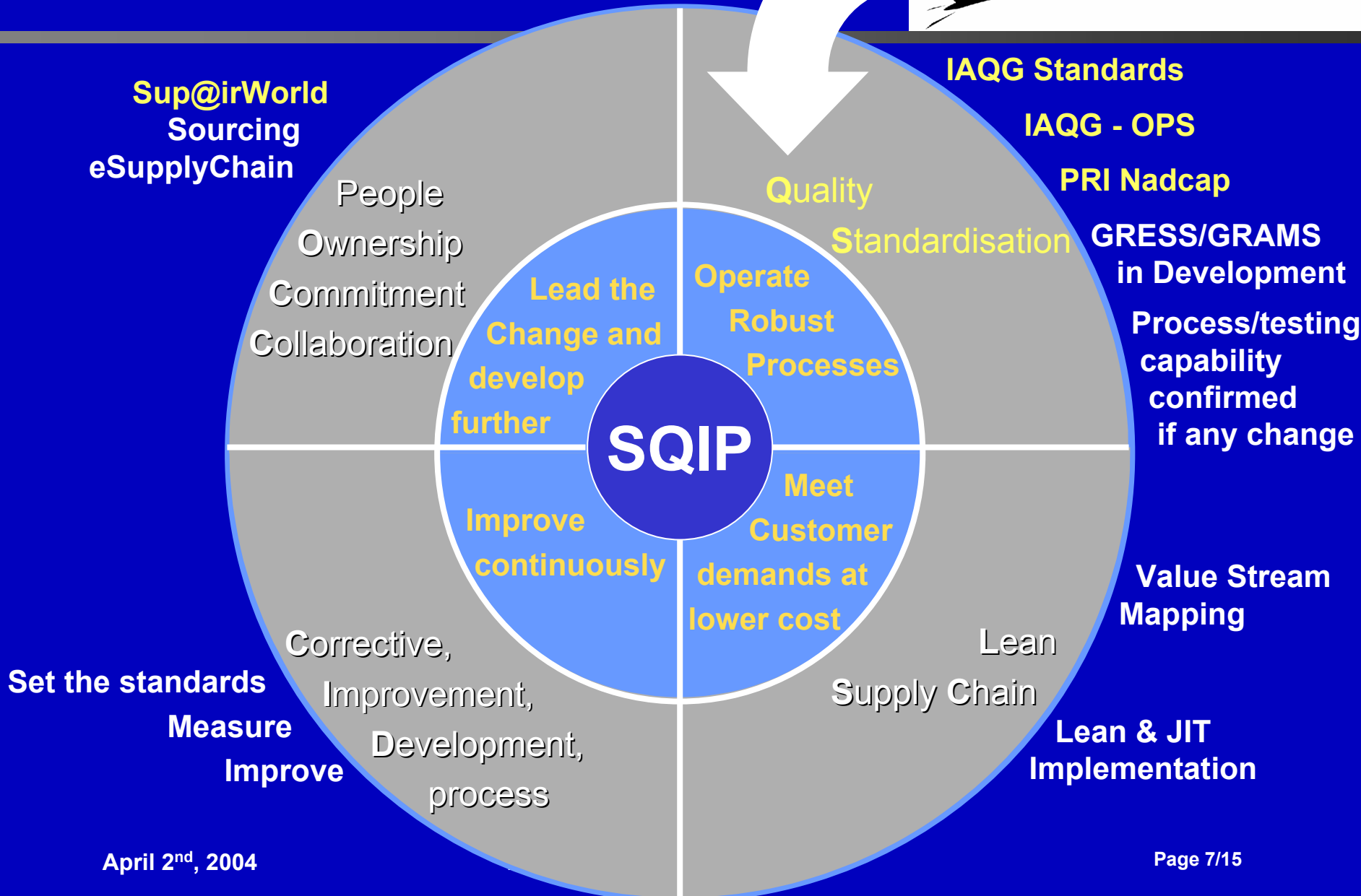
Airbus Supply Chain Quality Improvement Programme: SQIP



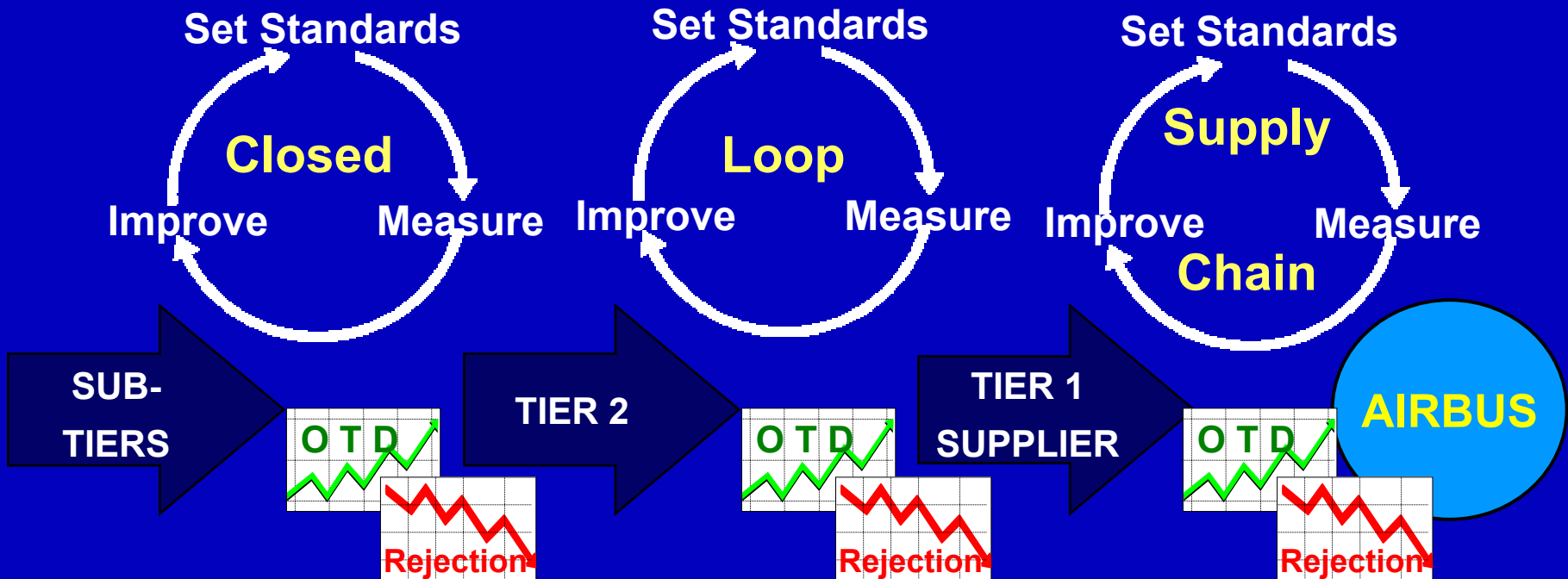
Proactive and collaborative approach, joining Aerospace Industry, Airbus and Suppliers efforts towards 4 main purposes:

Airbus SQIP

EN 9100 Series Certification



AIRBUS mandates its suppliers to :

- Gain and Maintain 9100 series certifications through an accredited Certification / Registration Body “CRB’s” according to IAQG Other Party Scheme “OPS” and registration in the OASIS database (no later than April 2005)
- Cascade these requirements to their sub-tiers

AIRBUS will not conduct/repeat Quality Systems audits unless:

- The scope does not match with Airbus products
- Evidence of poor performance / Quality System effectiveness

Airbus SQIP Special Process Certification



AIRBUS mandates its suppliers to :

- Gain & Maintain PRI Nadcap certification of the following Special Process Families (no later than April 05) :
 - Heat Treatment
 - Non Destructive Tests
 - Composite Manufacturing
- Cascade these requirements to their sub-tiers

AIRBUS will not conduct / repeat “SP” assessment unless:

- **Evidence of poor performance / “SP” effectiveness**
